Borough Project Updates

Main Street Construction

Phase II of the ongoing Main Street Revitalization project (Spring Street to Beaver Street) while delayed by supply chain disruptions, has resumed with M&B in the process of completing work in preparation for the demolition of the overhead facilities. Phase III from New Castle Street to the bridge going north is anticipated to be out for bid this summer.

Glade Run Development

The townhouses in Phase 1 are expected to be occupied by July 2025. Construction of the single-family homes in Phase 1 and Phase 2 will likely begin this summer. Paving in the eastern portion of Phase 3 should begin this spring to early summer. Paving in the western portion of Phase 3 is anticipated to start in early 2026. Single-family homes in the eastern portion of Phase 3 will be constructed in late July and occupied in November 2025. Paving of Phase 4 is expected to occur in June 2026. Waterlines will be installed on a phase-by-phase basis. Prior to the homes in Phase 4 being occupied, widening of the western section of Muntz Road will occur. The occupancy of Phase 3 will trigger a turning lane to be added at the main entrance to the development off of Route 68.

The developers have added an additional retention pond for the collection of any excess stormwater on the opposite side of Route 68.

A project of this stature is vastly complex, with a lot of moving parts. There continues to be good communication between the entities involved, and the developer has been addressing concerns as they develop. Zelienople Borough will continue to provide updates through the borough website.

Comprehensive Plan

We've been graced with several members of Council and the Community who have played vital roles on our Comprehensive Plan Steering Committee. The 2025 Comprehension Plan has reached the final stages. The Borough Planning Commission has started to review the document. The Comprehensive Plan was on the April 16th Planning Commission Agenda. Once the commissioners provide their recommendation, a public hearing will occur and finally to Borough Council.

Amphitheatre Project

Phase 1 of the Amphitheatre Terracing Project is anticipated to be completed by May 15th. Phase 1 of the project is for ADA accessibility. This project will provide better seating options and also handicapped parking. The project is being funded by a DCNR grant that the Park received in 2022 and donations from the James A. Ayers Sr. Foundation.



Historical Society Celebrates 50th Anniversary

The US Bicentennial was in 1976, but one year earlier in April of 1975, leading citizens of Zelienople founded the Zelienople Historical Society. There are still a few original members who remember those early days. The Passavant House, home of Zelie Passavant, was purchased in 1977 from local historian Lester Mohr. The Buhl House was donated to ZHS in 1992 by Joan Teichart. Both houses have extensive records and local artifacts from our town's history. ZHS members volunteer and maintain both these museum houses for our community.

Zelie Passavant's son, the Rev. William Passavant founded over 40 benevolent institutions, including schools, orphanages, and hospitals. His descendant Rev. Jay Passavant gave us our mission statement: Respecting Our Heritage, Reaffirming Our Values, Revitalizing Our Community (inspirational values for any organization).

This year's 50th celebration will include several events throughout the summer and fall. Watch for signs at the Passavant House and announcements on our webpage at: www.zeliehistory.org. The events will include monthly gatherings at the Passavant House back yard: live music, hot dogs, sauerkraut, watermelon, beer, pretzels, cake, ice cream, and a 1970s Disco Party.

Our local residents are the key to our past, present, and future, so let's celebrate this historical milestone as a community.

Zelienople Police Department's New Fleet

In March of this year, the Zelienople Police Department welcomed their new fleet! The new fleet consists of three SUVs and one pick-up truck. The pick-up truck is a new edition to the fleet. Previously, the department operated with three marked and one unmarked SUVs. The truck will be helpful in transporting equipment, such as road cones, throughout the borough during various special events.

The old police vehicles were past their useful life and repair bills were becoming costly. Mechanical issues of the old vehicles were causing frequent disruptions. Therefore, having new and mechanically sound vehicles was important to the department to avoid any disruptions in the daily patrols and duties.

Due to vehicle inventory issues stemming from COVID, ordering the new vehicles took longer much longer than normal. It took about a year from the time the new vehicles were ordered to when the vehicles became fully operational. After the department received the vehicles, the vehicles were sent to an outfitter to install interior equipment such as lights, siren, and the partition, as well as decals on the exterior of the vehicles. Each new vehicle is also fully equipped with Axon Fleet dash cameras as well as other necessary equipment such as AEDs and laptops.


