Placing the wrong items in your recycling bin can damage equipment, pose a danger to haulers and facility workers, and contaminate properly recycled materials.

It is extremely important to make sure only the correct items go in your curbside bin. By recycling the correct items, you are making the entire system efficient and ensuring success of the recycling program! All companies collecting residential curbside waste also collect curbside recyclables.

WHEN IN DOUBT, LEAVE IT OUT!

Ask Your Hauler:

1. what can be placed in your curbside recycling bin (*since this can vary by hauler*)
2. how recyclables are to be prepared for collection (*for instance: recyclables that contained food or other residue should be rinsed and lids should be discarded.*)
3. when your recyclables will be collected

Tips for Identifying, Storing and Transporting a Hazardous Waste



Identifying Hazardous Waste (and remember, electronics are considered hazardous too!)

The following warning words on a container can alert you to the hazardous nature of its contents:

Danger, Poison, Toxic, Corrosive, Volatile, Flammable, Inflammable, Combustible, Explosive, Caution, Warning, Harmful, Oxidizer, Irritant, Environmental Hazard

Proper Use & Storage of Hazardous Materials



- * MOST IMPORTANT: Follow the directions on the label.
- * Ask the dealer or manufacturer to provide more explanation if needed. Don't use more of the product than is recommended.
- * Never mix products; this can lead to explosions or poisonous gas being released.
- * Use hazardous products in well-ventilated areas and always use gloves, eye protection and air purifying respirators whenever warranted.
- * Never eat, drink or smoke where hazardous products are being used.
- * Keep products in their original containers.
- * If you do have to use a different container be sure to label adequately to prevent poisoning and for safe use and disposal.
- * Store all hazardous products upright, tightly sealed, and away from pets, children and food.



Transporting Household Hazardous Waste to a Hazardous Waste Collection

- * Never mix different chemicals! Toxic fumes or an explosion can result and it prevents recycling of the materials.
- * Leave waste products in their original containers, and make sure caps and/or lids are securely closed. Gasoline is highly flammable and should only be transported in purpose-designed gasoline cans or containers. Do not transport hazardous wastes in the same portion of your vehicle as humans or pets.
- * If the original container is leaking or damaged, place the entire container in a larger container such as a clean paint can, plastic bucket, or wrap securely with plastic. If you wrap up a container so that the original label cannot be seen, mark the contents to the best of your ability, and be sure to tell the collection staff what the contents are.
- * Separate different types of waste, such as paints, motor oil, batteries, pesticides, acids, etc. Place containers upright in sturdy cardboard boxes or plastic trays, and pad with newspaper. You may also want to line your car with plastic before you pack the car.
- * Put containers in trunk or rear of your car, not on passenger seats. Come straight to the Hazardous Waste Collection to avoid any problems with the waste.
- * Don't eat, drink or smoke while handling household hazardous wastes. Wash your hands after handling these materials. Never put hazardous waste into trash bags or trash cans. Lids can come off causing chemicals to mix and possibly creating dangerous reactions.

AMMUNITION

NEVER throw away ammunition in regular household trash—it poses a very serious threat to trash collectors and landfill employees.

Check with local gun shops to find people who collect spent shell casings for refilling purposes.

Call your local or state police department to ask about proper disposal of live ammunition or call the Butler County Sheriff's Dept. at 724.284.5245.

APPLIANCES (non-freon)

BATTERIES (lithium ion)

Lithium ion batteries that are rechargeable are most commonly found in digital cameras, cell phones and lap top computers. They contain and use lithium metallic oxide for a cathode and a carbon material as an anode. The electrolyte is a lithium salt.

This battery type can be recycled through Call2Recycle.org, or you can use their Drop-off site locator by telephone, 877-273-2925. Participating retail collection points include Batteries Plus, Home Depot, Lowes, and Staples. (Source: PA DEP)

Information from the US Postal Service: Take the following steps to investigate whether a manufacturer offers a recycling program for its smoke detectors:

1. Locate the manufacturer's telephone number or website on the back of the smoke detector.
2. Call the number provided or visit the website to confirm whether a recycling

program is available, as well as the details of the return process. Some manufacturers offer returns via a mail-back program.

If the manufacturer will not take back the ionization or dual-sensor smoke detector, contact the local or state environmental agency to identify whether a local recycling program exists and, if so, request the program details. Local recycling programs may include drop-off locations for used smoke detectors. If recycling is unavailable, the regulatory agency can also confirm whether any local restrictions exist on disposal of smoke detectors in the trash.

REMEMBER: NEVER try to disassemble a smoke detector!!
